


Conisbrough is a village near Mexborough

## Conisbrough castle facts



The first castles built in England were built by the Normans.

The Normans invaded Britain during a battle in 1066 called the 'Battle of Hastings' It was fought between William of Normandy and his army from France and King Harold Godwinson and his English army. William won and became the King of England. He was known as William the Conqueror.

Founded by William De Warenne.

The castle probably started as a **fortified earthwork**
